literally 'it gave me'... sadness, joy, anger, shame

B. "I felt" (adjective)
*We use **PONERSE** in the **PRETERIT** followed by an **ADJECTIVE** to say that someone got/became happy, sad, etc. (=felt...)*

C. To say that someone FELT LIKE

Use the indirect object pronoun with DAR in the 3rd person preterit + ganas de + infinitive (to me mean it/they gave you desire <ganas de>...)
